#### STATE SUPPORT SPECIAL FUNDS

In Fiscal Year 2022, SB2937 authorized the MGC to receive \$50,000 from the Capital Expense Fund. This money was for the purchase of vehicles. The agency does not anticipate receiving any State Support Special Funds in FY 2023 or FY 2024.

#### FEDERAL FUNDS

The Mississippi Gaming Commission is a participant in a Federal Equitable Sharing Agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice. When the MGC participates in a law enforcement activity in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Justice, we are entitled to an equitable-share of the federally forfeited assets. To remain in compliance with the agreement, the Commission must use such funds for law enforcement purposes only, in accordance with the statutes and guidelines that govern equitable sharing. It is further stipulated that these assets may only be used to augment the law enforcement budget and not to supplant it. While there are no such funds as of FY 2022, any future fund balance due to seized and forfeited funds can only be used above and beyond our normal operating budget.

#### I. Program Description:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission is charged with enforcing the law and regulating casinos with regard to the Mississippi Gaming Control Act (MS Code Ann. 1972 75-76-1 through 75-76-313).

#### II. Program Objective:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission seeks to maintain the integrity of the gaming industry in Mississippi. This is achieved in a two-fold method: (1) Maintain the integrity of the gaming property and (2) Maintain the integrity of the gaming patron. Current program activities are supported by the funding (FY 23 Estimated & FY 24 increase for continuations) of MBR-1-03.

III. Current program activities as supported by the funding in Columns 6-15 (FY 2023 & FY 2024Increase/Decrease for continuations) of MBR-1-03 and designated Budget Unit Decisions columns of MBR-1-03-A:

#### (D) Salaries:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission (MGC) requests additional salary compensation of \$77,267 in the Riverboat Program. We request an increase in general funds of \$27,267 and in special funds of \$50,000 in order to accomplish our goal. During FY 2024, the MGC anticipates the retirement of two Enforcement Division supervisors, and requests \$38,804 to accomplish title changes for their replacements. These key positions will be filled by promotion within the agency. It is important to have employees who possess a thorough knowledge of the casino regulations take over these supervisory rolls.

In the Tunica office we anticipate promoting a Law Enforcement Officer Supervisor to replace the retiring Law Enforcement Officer Manager. In the Biloxi office we anticipate promoting a Law Enforcement Officer III (degree) to replace the retiring Law Enforcement Officer Supervisor. The MGC is requesting funding of \$38,463 for six (6) in-range adjustments. We anticipate six employees completing the Certified Public Manager (CPM) program, and would like to award a 5% increase to each employee for this accomplishment.

#### (E) Contractual Services:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests an increase of \$37,855 in Contractual Services for the Riverboat Program. Being an agency comprised mostly of law enforcement officers and accountants, specific training is mandatory in order for certifications to be maintained. The MGC also maintains several data bases that require professional assistance, annual maintenance or upgrades. We have noticed significant increase in most all contracts due to the cost of inflation being passed on to us, the customer. These items will not expand the MGC, but will allow for maintaining the level of regulatory services necessary to carry out the responsibilities placed on the MGC in the Gaming Control Act.

#### (F) Commodities:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests an increase of \$10,000 in the Major Object Category Commodities. The Agency will continue to be fiscally responsible, but there has been a rise in supply costs as well as shipping fees. This will not expand the programs of the agency, but will ensure there are no disruption of services. The MGC has three offices statewide and must provide an adequate amount of supplies for all staff members to do their jobs.

Year 2024. Being an agency comprised mostly of law enforcement officers and accountants, specific training is mandatory in order for certifications to be maintained. The MGC also maintains several data bases that require professional assistance, annual maintenance, or upgrades. We have noticed significant increases in most all contracts due to the cost of inflation being passed on to us, the customer. These items will not expand the MGC, but will allow for maintaining the level of regulatory services necessary to carry out the responsibilities placed on the MGC in the Gaming Control Act.

#### COMMODITIES:

The MGC requests an increase of \$10,000 in Commodities. The Agency will continue to be fiscally responsible, but there has been a rise in almost all supply costs as well as shipping fees. This will not expand the programs of the agency, but will ensure there are no disruption of services. The MGC maintains three offices statewide and must provide an adequate amount of supplies for all staff members to do their jobs.

#### CAPITAL OUTLAY:

#### D-1 Capital Outlay Other Than Equipment:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no appropriation in the Major Object Category Capital Outlay Other Than Equipment for Fiscal Year 2024.

#### D-2 Equipment:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests level funding in the Major Object Category Capital Outlay for Fiscal Year 2024.

#### D-3 Vehicles:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission seeks level funding in the Major Object Category Vehicles for Fiscal Year 2024. No monies were spent on vehicles in FY 2019, FY 2020, or FY 2021. The MGC ordered for five (5) vehicles from negotiated State contracts early in the fall of 2022. However, due to cancelations by the manufacturers, only two (2) vehicles were received. Capital Expense Fund money in addition to General Funds were used in FY 2022 to purchase these vehicles. These are replacement vehicles, and will not increase the actual number of vehicles. At the time of the budget, the old vehicles had not gone to auction and were technically still in the MGC's possession. Once sold, the MGC will maintain a fleet of 56 vehicles.

The agency needs to replace some aging vehicles in FY 2023 and FY 2024, and will make every effort to purchase vehicles. For FY 2023, Special Funds and General Funds will be equal sources of money to purchase these vehicles. The MGC hopes to replace four (4) vehicles in FY 2023 and four (4) in FY 2024.

In order to carry out the responsibilities placed on the Agency by the Gaming Control Act, enforcement agents, auditors, and compliance officers must frequently drive to all licensed casinos and charitable gaming facilities for regulatory purposes. These facilities are spread throughout Mississippi. Many vehicles in the Agency's fleet have reached the requirements of age and high mileage necessary for replacement. This increases the amount necessary for repairs and maintenance in order to maintain our fleet. As of FY 2023, the agency has sixteen (16) of the total fifty-six (56) vehicles with mileage over 100,000. The Agency recognizes the need to keep cars in a constant rotation and annually rid itself of older high mileage vehicles needing costly maintenance.

## SUBSIDIES, LOANS, & GRANTS:

The Mississippi Gaming Commission requests no appropriation in the Major Object Category Subsidies, Loans, & Grants for Fiscal Year 2024.
